Newnan Utilities Compost Facility

Newnan Utilities' state-of-the-art composting site has been even busier recently receiving an additional 175+ loads of tree debris each day since storm clean-up in the City of Newnan began. The site provides our community with an alternative solution to landfill dumping and the burning of tree wastes, solidifying our position of accountable environmental management and supporting our commitment to the NU Recycles initiative.

The facility composts bio-solids from the Wahoo Creek and Mineral Springs Wastewater Treatment Plants and combines that with the processed tree waste, resulting in the creation of NuSoil, a product useful for landscaping, gardening, agricultural application, and topsoil remediation. NuSoil has been certified as safe and effective by the University of Georgia soil experts.

Tips For Efficient Outdoor Watering

As temperatures rise, so does outdoor water use, mostly on lawns and landscapes. Follow these money-saving tips for efficient water use in spring and summer:

- Avoid watering in the middle of the day, when the hot sun will evaporate much of the water before it can get to thirsty plants
- Check for leaks in pipes, hoses, faucets, and couplings
- Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants to slow evaporation
- Position sprinklers carefully so water lands on the lawn or garden, not paved areas
- Water your lawn only when it needs it. A good way to see if your lawn needs watering is to step on the grass. If it springs back up when you move, it doesn't need water.

When the EF-4 Tornado struck Newnan in the dark of night on March 26th, the morning light revealed a devastation like our community had never seen before. Newnan Utilities crews responded immediately and worked around-the-clock to keep everyone safe from downed power lines and poles and to start the process of restoring power to our electric customers. 6,500 of our 10,000 were without power immediately after the storm's fury. Within five days, 5,800 of the 6,500 customers had power returned to their homes, thanks to the work of our employees and to the help of crews from multiple cities throughout Georgia and Alabama. Thanks to ECG (Electric Cities of Georgia) and their quick coordination in sending help our way, more than 40 crews came to our town to help us rebuild and restore along with electrical contractors, tree removal companies, the DOT, and Georgia Power.

- We continue to work to help our customers and the community:
- Re-installation of streetlights is underway. There were 164 streetlights damaged or lost during the storm.
 - 208 electric meters were damaged, and all have been replaced except on those homes and businesses pending approval from the City of Newnan.
 - Replacement of damaged water meters continues after approximately 46 were damaged in the storm.
 - 270 poles have been replaced.
 - 70 transformers have been replaced.
 - Newnan Utilities' Compost Site is receiving an additional 175+ loads of tree debris each day since storm clean-up in the City of Newnan began.
